

**REDFORD JUNIOR CHAMBER
CONSTITUTION -- 2007
Approved: 2-14-2007; 11-15-2008**

ARTICLE I – NAME

Section I –

The name of this organization shall be the Redford Junior Chamber.

Section II –

The principal office of this organization shall be located in Wayne County, Michigan.

ARTICLE II – AFFILIATION

Section I –

This organization shall be and hereby is affiliated with the Michigan Junior Chamber, The United States Junior Chamber of Commerce and Junior Chamber International and is subject to the Constitution, By-Laws and Policies of these bodies in so far as they affect and prescribe the functions of the local Jaycee Chapter.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

Section I –

The purpose of this organization shall be:

- (a) To provide the young people constituting its membership, training in the leadership process and to instill civic consciousness to better their usefulness as citizens
- (b) Civic service through the organized efforts of the young people of the Community and it's citizens through active, constructive projects

ARTICLE IV – MEMBERSHIP

Section I –

Any young person of good character, whose age shall be defined in accordance to the U.S. Michigan by-law 4.2 on individual membership, is eligible for active membership in this organization with full privileges thereof.

(A) Membership in this Corporation shall include three (3) classes as follows:

1. Individual Member
2. Honorary Member
3. Life Member

Section II –

Active membership shall cease on the member's anniversary date when they have reached the age limit of active membership.

ARTICLE V – GOVERNMENT

Section I –

The government of this corporation shall be vested in the Board of Directors, the members of which shall number, qualify and be elected as provided in the by -laws.

Section II –

The officers and directors of the organization shall be elected in the manner prescribed by the by-laws and shall hold office for a period of one year, or until their successors are duly elected and charged, as long as they meet the requirement for membership as established by the United States Junior Chamber of Bylaw 4.2, and who is in good standing with the Michigan Junior Chamber and the Redford Junior Chamber.

ARTICLE VI – DISSOLUTION

Section I –

In the event that the Redford Junior Chamber should dissolve its membership, and no longer be considered a chapter in good standing with the United States Junior Chamber, then all assets of the Redford Junior Chamber shall revert to the Michigan Junior Chamber Foundation for their sole possession.
